Important Information for all AP Students

We wanted to be sure that you were aware that there are free, live AP review lessons happening online each day. These are being delivered by AP teachers from across the country. You can access them through this link: attend [Online- AP review courses](#).

The exams will focus on the first 75% of the course content because there is recognition internationally on the loss of class time. Please be assured that we are working hard to minimize the impact this has on admissions and enrolment and will provide updates relevant to the upcoming summer and fall semesters as decisions are finalized.

This is a constantly changing situation and especially disruptive for those considering university, but we are working hard on contingency planning with all of our departments and will keep prospective students informed.

We wish all students and their families the very best during this difficult period.

Student Transcript Service (STS)

As of March 28th, 2020, 265 Grade 12s have authorized PSIs to receive their transcripts; **129 Grade 12s have not.**

May 1, 2020 is the deadline to enter PSI Selections in order for BC, OUAC, U of Alberta, and U of Calgary to be able to pick up marks on May 4, 2020. Your second term marks were sent to the Ministry before Spring Break.

Students can continue making selections for the final months of this school year on the STS website. **July 10, 2020** is the deadline for students to have selected the institutions to receive transcripts in the late-July distribution. Students should be sure to include out of province and international institutions.

University of British Columbia

In light of COVID-19, you may be wondering how your application to UBC could be affected. Don't worry – UBC's Undergraduate Admissions Office wants all applicants to know that they are still hard at work and UBC's admissions process is continuing as normal.

While UBC's offers of admission are conditional on final grades, UBC recognizes that COVID-19 is evolving in many places around the world and is interrupting normal school and extra-curricular activities.

UBC is aware that applicants have had their schooling interrupted in recent weeks. UBC understands that applicants may now face difficulties like having to take online classes, being unable to complete all the activities listed in Personal Profiles or experiencing the cancellation of final exams. UBC appreciates and is sympathetic to these concerns.

Please note that while all in-person appointments, including drop-ins, will be suspended until further notice, our team is still hard at work remotely. University of the Fraser Valley

UFV is offering direct-entry degree programs and corresponding diplomas/certificates to many of their programs. In addition to receiving a formal offer by email, BC high school applicants will also receive a Welcome Package in the mail. Applicants will then be directed to formally accept their offer online.

In order for applicants to be considered eligible for admission, they must first provide UFV with transcript authorization from the Ministry of Education. UFV wants to ensure that late applicants and those who have not yet provided their authorization will receive a Welcome Package as soon as possible. When submitting transcript authorization, please remember to select the option in the Student Transcript Service section which sends transcripts with updates until at least August 31, rather than selecting the "send now" (interim) option.

Indigenous Student Bursary

- \$1,000 (x2)
- The purpose of this bursary is to assist Indigenous students in the Langley School District (SD 35) to continue their education
- The bursary is open to Indigenous students in Grades 10, 11 and 12 within SD35
- The bursary will be available to students who wish to continue their education but are discouraged because of their financial circumstances. Types of education programs may include:
 - Completion of high school graduation, with Dogwood Diploma
 - Improvement of grades to permit access to post-secondary
 - Co-operative or apprenticeship program
 - First year post-secondary courses
- The bursary may be used to offset any expenses arising from enrolment in secondary or post-secondary courses in the following year. These might include, but are not limited to:
 - Tuition fees
 - Course materials (books, manuals, subscriptions) and supplies
 - Tools and/or safety equipment for apprenticeship program
 - Living expenses
- The bursary may be repeated for the same student, as long as they are enrolled in the SD 35 system
- Recipients will be chosen by a sub-committee of ya:ǵstǵl. Selection of the recipients will be based on meeting the above criteria as well as:
 - Demonstrated commitment to continuing education
 - Submission of a brief statement as to what the bursary will be used for, and how the funds will assist
 - the student in pursuing their education
 - Recommendation/endorsement by staff at the student's school
 - Preference will be given to students who are not receiving any other form of financial support (scholarships or bursaries)
