# Important Scholarship Information

# WGSS 2020 Local + District + Ministry District/Authority Scholarship Application

On December 2, the 2020 WGSS Local + District and Ministry District/Authority Scholarship Application was posted on the WGSS website. There was a presentation to interested students on November 28. The PowerPoint can be viewed on the WGSS Counselling website.

There is one application form that covers all three scholarships students may apply for:

- 1. Local (WGSS) Scholarships
- 2. District (SD35) Scholarships
- 3. Ministry District/Authority Scholarships

#### INFORMATION ABOUT THE THREE SCHOLARSHIPS Local (WGSS) + District (SD35) Scholarships

The Langley School District Foundation administers funds collected from various individuals, service clubs and other donors. Awards are available to Grade 12 students proceeding to post-secondary studies in the future. The scholarships in this fund are divided into two categories: (1) District Awards - open to all Grade 12 students in SD35 who apply and meet the criteria. The winner of each award is selected based on highest GPA which satisfies the criteria established by the donor; and, (2) Local Awards – open to students who attend a particular Langley high school (e.g. WGSS). The WGSS Scholarship Committee considers the donor's criteria then leadership, service, financial need, and academics. When students complete the Local + District Scholarship Application, they are considered for all awards in both categories.

#### **District (SD35) Scholarships**

There are approximately 40 District scholarships available to all Grade 12 SD35 students through the District Scholarship Fund. A listing of these awards is on pages 10 and 11 of the District Scholarship Handbook, which is available on the District Scholarship Website. Last year, 14 WGSS students won awards totalling \$17,750. Be aware that the District Awards list is subject to change as an updated list is not available until April 2020 when donors have confirmed their commitments for the year.

#### **Local (WGSS) Scholarships**

There are approximately 27 scholarships available only for Walnut Grove Secondary graduates. Many of these scholarships have multiple winners. Last year, 53 students won scholarships for a total of \$32,850. The list is available on the WGSS Counselling Website. Be aware that the Local Awards list is subject to change as an up-dated Local (WGSS) list is not available until April 2020 when donors have confirmed their commitments for the year.

#### **Ministry District/Authority Scholarships**

- Value: \$1,250
- Last year 36 WGSS graduates received this scholarship resulting in \$45,000 given by the Ministry of Education as vouchers for postsecondary education.

   excellence in one of the following seven areas of
   interest or strength:
- Indigenous Languages and Culture
   (commitment to language revitalization or indigenous culture in school or the community)
- Fine Arts (e.g. 3-4 courses (in and/or out of school) in one of Visual Arts, Dance, Drama, Music)
- 3. **Applied Skills** (e.g. 3-4 courses in one of Business Ed, Technology Ed, Computers, Home Economics)

- Physical Activity (e.g. 3-4 courses in PHE or Provincial/National participation in Athletics, Dance, or Gymnastics)
- 5. **International Languages** (2 or more languages documented or transcript, besides English)
- 6. **Community Service** (local, global and cultural experience)
- 7. **Technical and Trades Training** (e.g. Carpentry, Automotive, Electrical, Cook Training)
- Please note: The District/Authority Scholarship (STEP 3) is a separate application found on the WGSS Counselling website.
- Deadline: February 20, 2020, 12:00 noon to the WGSS Counselling Centre. See the following scholarship link for details: WGSS District/Authority Application Link

#### CRITERIA for all three scholarships: Local and District Awards + Ministry District/Authority Scholarships

- Must be a Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident (Landed Immigrant)
- Must be in a position to graduate
- Must have a SIN number at the time application is submitted
- Grade-Point Average (GPA) must be at least 67% based on the best 12 courses which must include: Language Arts 11 and 12, a Socials 11 or 12, a Math 11 or 12 and a Science 11 or 12
- Must have completed Grade 11 courses required for graduation by February 1<sup>st</sup>, such as Math 11.
- Students taking courses off campus through distance education must provide proof from their distributed learning provider (e.g. online school or night school) verifying that 70% of the course is completed by February with proof of current mark.

#### **Application Process**

To apply for the Local and District and the District/Authority Scholarship students must be sure to complete all of the following steps and submit the printed application to the Counselling Centre by 12:00 noon on February 20, 2020 at 12:00.

- 1. Print the Checklist Instruction Sheet that has the steps for the Scholarship Application process
- 2. STEP 1 ONLINE Demographic Data Information

- STEP 2 Scholarship Application for Local (WGSS) + District (Langley Schools), include Comprehensive Resume
- STEP 3 OPTIONAL and Supplemental Forms for BC Ministry of Education District Authority Scholarship
- 5. STEP 4 OPTIONAL Financial Need Form

#### Winners + Claiming Awards Information

- If students win a Local or District or Ministry
  District/Authority Award, they will receive an
  invitation in mid-May to come with their
  parent(s) to our Awards Recognition Afternoon
  on Monday, June 1<sup>st</sup> at 3:45 pm in our school
  cafeteria. At that time, students will learn what
  scholarships they have won.
- Winners of Local and District Scholarships must redeem the scholarship within two years of graduation. This is done by providing proof of enrolment or a tuition receipt and completing a Scholarship Claim Form, which is submitted by the student to our counselling department. The completed form is then signed and forwarded to the Langley School Foundation before the end of June for payment.
- Note: Cheques may not be prepared until October so students cannot count on using the scholarship money for September tuition.
- Winners of the District/Authority Award have five years to use the tuition voucher they will receive in the mail from the Ministry of Education in November after graduation.

#### **Opportunity to Become a Donor**

As a member of the Walnut Grove Community, we encourage you to think about whom you could nudge to consider participating in the scholarship program. Generally, scholarships are \$300 – 500 and income tax receipts are available. Donors specify the criteria – for example: financial need, participation in a particular course of study, or pursuing a particular occupational area. # Student Transcript Service (STS)

As of November 30, 2019, 214 Grade 12s have authorized PSIs to receive their transcripts; **183 Grade 12s have not**. Capstone teachers and English teachers have the list should students wish to check.

Our Counsellors and Career Advisors are available to assist students with any questions they may have. The Transcript section of our website has three YouTube videos to help students complete the steps involved.

## Self-Reporting Grades vs. Sending Transcript

Undergraduate Admissions offices have different procedures for receiving students' marks. Some institutions pick-up marks from the Ministry of Education while other institutions want students to self-report or upload a current transcript. Below is information frequently requested by WGSS students. Please refer to the last page of this newsletter for a reference chart summarizing these and other institutions requirements and deadlines.

#### **University of British Columbia**

- When you apply to UBC, you are required to provide UBC with your Personal Education Number (PEN).
- When you access <u>StudentTranscripts.gov.bc.ca</u>, select "Send my transcript now and allow this Post-Secondary Institution to request transcript updates" and choose the default date (one year from the date of your order). UBC will then be able to receive your grades continuously through the XML system.
- UBC generally picks-up marks for the first time after **December 15.**
- All applicants for Fall 2020 admission must apply by January 15 and authorize UBC to obtain their marks through the Student Transcript Service by the same January 15 deadline.
- If you wish to have a distributed learning course used in your academic assessment, you must have 100% completed the course by February 1.

- The DL school must submit your final grade to the Ministry in time for UBC to evaluation your application.
- February 15, 2020 is the deadline to submit documents showing you meet the <u>English</u> <u>Language Admission Standard</u> (ELAS) if a student has not been in Canada for four consecutive years of study.
- UBC Deadlines and Additional Information

#### **Simon Fraser University**

- All BC high school students applying for Fall 2020 must self-report their grades. If SFU has not received your grades by the deadline your application will be cancelled. The self-reporting portal opened December 2. WGSS students should wait and report their Term 1 marks (which they will have on December 13).
- SFU allows students to self-report more than once. If you do not gain acceptance after your first self-report of Term 1 marks, try again after you have received your Term 2 marks.

#### **SFU Deadlines to Self-Report:**

- Jan. 31 SFU Undergraduate Scholars Entrance Scholarship applicants
- **Feb. 7** Beedie School of Business applicants and Sustainable Energy Engineering applicants
- Mar. 15 All other applicants
- You need to self-report all final marks for Grade 11 courses and interim or final marks for Grade 12 courses. If you have a grade of TS (Transfer Standing), enter a grade of 50% for that course.
- Grades for online courses may be used for admission however the course must be 100% complete by January 31
- SFU Self-Report Information

#### **University of Victoria**

- The self-reporting period opens on **February 15** and closes on **March 31**
- Current Grade 12 students MUST self-report their interim/final Grade 11 and 12 marks by March 31, 2020 to be considered for admission and grade-based entrance scholarships for September 2020 entry
- You can only self-report your grades once, so be sure to wait until you have your Term 2 marks (March 6<sup>th</sup>).

- Students who meet all of UVIC's <u>admission</u> <u>requirements</u> and have satisfactory admission averages will be eligible to receive early conditional offers of acceptance
- If you don't receive an early conditional offer based on your self-reported grades, you can still be considered for conditional admission:
  - BC students will automatically be reconsidered when their electronic grades arrive in May IF they have completed the Student Transcripts process
- Last year some students had difficulty accessing the self-reporting tool from their applications using the web browser Google Chrome.
   Students are encouraged to self-report using Firefox or Internet Explorer for best results
- If you are taking a DL or on-line course you can self-report a midterm grade as long as you have already completed 50% or more of the course including assignments and tests. The entire course must be 100% completely finished no later than May 31.

#### **Thompson River University**

- Applications must send an official transcript to TRU in order to be considered for admission.
- For competitive programs such as the Bachelor of Science in Nursing and the Respiratory Therapy Diploma, it's recommended to send an official interim transcripts (or a Diploma Verification Report) prior to the application deadline.
- TRU applicants must also select the option "Send Interim and Final Transcript" through the Student Transcript Service portal before March 1st

#### **Capilano University**

- Students are required to submit official high school transcripts for the purposes of admission.
- Cap U's self-report portal opens on January 1 and closes March 31.
- Capilano Transcript Information Link

#### **Kwantlen Polytechnic University**

- All BC high school students must release their transcripts to KPU through the <u>Student</u> <u>Transcripts Service (STS)</u> by **May 1**. Please select the option "Send Interim and Final Marks when they become available" for KPU to electronically receive your official grades in May and July.
- **Deadline** to submit interim grades for limited intake programs: **March 1.**
- After submitting an application for admission to KPU, you will first receive an email from KPU with your KPU student number. After about one or two weeks, you will receive another email with log in information for <u>Online Self-Service</u> and <u>KPU Student Email</u>. Make sure to log-in frequently to check on your application status, outstanding checklist items, and transfer credit.
- Check your myKwantlen Account Online Self-Service – which is located in the box in the bottom right hand corner of the screen
- If a transcript is required, it will be noted when you check the status of your application.
- Interim grades for night school or online courses must be submitted by May 1

#### **Trinity Western University**

- If students have not already provided their transcript to TWU, they should be checking their application status through their TWU account and provide an up-dated transcript as requested.
- Students also need to ensure they have selected the "Send Final Transcript" option through the Student Transcript Service.
- TWU Application Requirements

#### **University of the Fraser Valley**

- UFV utilizes students' interim grades from the Student Transcript Service
- Applicants will receive all communication through their MyUFV email account as they progress through the application process.
- Check your MyUFV account often. UFV will send only the final admission letter to your postal mail address; all other correspondence will be via email through your MyUFV e-mail account
- UFV Transcript Information Link

#### **University of Alberta**

- On the application form to UAlberta, you will be asked to report your final Grade 11 and Grade 12 high school marks at the time you apply (e.g. courses done last year or at summer school).
- Submitting this information at the time you apply will allow UAIberta to begin processing your application immediately and make an admission offer more quickly
- If you have applied for a scholarship or award from the university, you must submit all your required documentation, including courses, marks, and transcripts, by **December 11, 2019**, in order for your award application to be evaluated in time.
- After you have applied to study at UAlberta, you will receive a log in and password for <u>Bear Tracks</u>, UAlberta's online system. You can log in to Bear Tracks to access your "To-Do List," which will tell you which documents you must submit in order to complete your UAlberta application.
- The University of Alberta is only able to obtain transcripts from the BC Ministry of Education in mid-May and late-July.

#### **University of Calgary**

- Initial transcripts (PDF versions are accepted) should be up-loaded through the MyUCalgary application portal.
- The University of Calgary is a participant of the BC Student Transcript Service
- If students wish to be considered for early admission prior to January 15<sup>th</sup>, the University of Calgary is recommending students upload their transcript directly in the application portal. For more information regarding document submission, please click here.

#### **Ontario Universities**

- Ensure you have selected the applicable
   Ontario University on the Student Transcript
   Service portal to ensure your final transcript is sent directly to the university.
- If a transcript is required, you must send your high school transcript directly to the university.
   In many cases, institutions ask students to selfreport their marks and will not ask you to send a transcript unless you are applying for a scholarship.

- The BC Excellence Scholarship is awarded to 55 students who are nominated by their school (one nomination per high school). The Ministry of Education is looking for demonstrated community service, both inside and outside school, as well as aptitude and commitment to a chosen career path.
- Additional criteria includes:
  - "B" (73% or above) in their Language Arts 11 final mark
  - "B" average in final course marks that fulfill graduation requirements of Science 11 or 12, Math 11 and Social Studies 11 or 12, with no more than one "C+" (67% or above) final course mark (marks lower than "C+" are not accepted)
  - Maintain a "B" average or better in Grades 11 and 12 final course marks required for graduation

  - o Comprehensive Resume
  - 2 Letters of Reference one from the community and one from a school employee
