All Grade 12 students must create a BCeID and have a STS account to view and print their final transcript. An account is also required for post-secondary institutions to view marks when students apply and/or to receive final transcripts in July.

Applications are open

As of October 6, applications to all CapU programs opened for Fall 2022 admission. Go to the [CapU website](#) and:

Camosun College/UVIC BSN Program

As a student in the Camosun/UVic BSN program, you can move seamlessly from your education at Camosun to completion of your Nursing degree at the University of Victoria.

Students apply for admission once and can take electives at either institution. You'll spend 2.5 years at Camosun, which includes 5 academic semesters and 2 spring practicum terms. You'll then move to the University of Victoria to finish up your final 2 semesters and consolidated practice experiences, which takes a total of 1.5 years. You may be eligible for entrance scholarships to UVic at this time. There is priority seating in this program for students of Indigenous ancestry. [Admission Requirements](#)

University of Fraser Valley

Application Process

UFV started accepting applications on October 1 through [Education Planner BC](#). Within a few days of applying, students will receive an email from UFV letting them know what they need to submit in order to complete

their application. For most programs, UFV simply requires access to a student's transcript, which applicants can grant using [BC's Student Transcript Service](#). The student assigns permission for UFV to receive his/her records, by selecting the “Send now with updates until...”; this ensures UFV receives transcripts after graduation. Once UFV receives authorization, UFV will send the student an email confirming the application is complete. For most programs, students will then wait for a late February/early March offer.

University of Alberta

BC students will no longer apply through ApplyAlberta. Students should use this [link](#) to apply through the U of A website. Students are encouraged to apply as **early** as possible as U of A uses Grade 11 marks when making early admission decisions. The Early Admission Scholarship deadline is [January 12](#).

Queen's University

If you are considering applying to Queen's, you are encouraged to have your application completed by **mid-November**. Queen's scholarship deadline is **December 1st**. Queen's does rolling admission offers. Students with a high GPA will likely hear from Queen's by the beginning of January.

Queen's Accelerated Route to Medicine Program

Queen's has changed the criteria for 2022. The Accelerated Route to Medical School (QuARMS) is a unique opportunity for 10 high school students (Canadian citizens or permanent residents) to apply for entry to medical school after only two years of undergraduate study in the Arts, Science, Computing Science or Health Science in the Faculty of Arts and Science. Beginning this year, the QuARMS pathway is reserved for **Indigenous applicants and applicants who identify as Black African, Black Caribbean, Black North American or multi-racial students who have and identify with their Black ancestry**. Applicants will indicate their interest in this pathway through their

OUAC application. Interested students must apply to OUAC by **December 8, 2021**, and are also required to have their transcript(s) to Queen's by December 8, 2021 to be considered. The deadline for Student Awards to receive completed applications for any of the Major Admission Awards has been moved to **December 8, 2021**.
