University of Saskatchewan

<u>December 1</u> is the application and document deadline for early admission to certain programs, and for the Best and Brightest Entrance Scholarships.

Please <u>check here</u> to see what programs are offered at U of Sask.

Residence applications are open for Fall/Winter 2022/2023. Students are encouraged to apply early. Applicants will be offered residence in the same order in which they applied. Students do not need to have been admitted to submit an application to live in residence.

For **VetMed**, it is recommended that students complete the 2-year pre-vet courses in either Animal Science or Animal Bioscience in the College of Agriculture and Bioresources. There are 20 seats/year available for Vet School for BC residents.

All students who apply to U of Sask must have completed Pre-Calculus Math 12 with a minimum mark of 70%. <u>U Sask Admission Link</u>

Students who stay in Saskatchewan for work after completing their degree may be eligible for a refund of up to \$20,000 of tuition fees they have paid under the Government of Saskatchewan's Graduate Retention Program. Link to Graduate Retention Program

Considering **Medical School**: 95% of first year positions are reserved for Saskatchewan residents. A Saskatchewan resident is defined as someone who has physically resided in Saskatchewan for the three years <u>immediately preceding</u> August 1 of the year, they are seeking admission. Students who attend U of Sask for their undergraduate degree are considered residents of Saskatchewan and thereby have an increased opportunity to be considered for the U of Sask Medical School.

Deadlines

- December 8 is the deadline to submit the online Major Admission Award (MAA) application on SOLUS (Queen's online student centre). Queens recommends that students who are planning to apply for an MAA apply to Queen's (through OUAC) by November 15 so that students can access the scholarship application.
- February 15 is the recommended last day to submit a current high school transcript, including a list of S2 courses (where applicable).

Schulich Leader Scholarships
