UBC

First Round Offers

First-round offers of admission for applicants who submitted their UBC online application on or before December 1 will be going out soon and will continue until the end of February.

UBC English Language Admissions Standard

Deadline: February 15

To meet the English Language Admissions Standard (ELAS), students need to complete four or more consecutive years of recognized, full-time education in English within Canada immediately prior to attending UBC. Visit UBC's [ELAS page](#) for the eight other ways to meet this requirement.

Indigenous Students: Self-Identification

Students who wish to discuss self-identification on their UBC application with an advisor for Indigenous students can connect with an advisor at indigenous.recruitment@ubc.ca.

Priority Access to Housing

Students who identify as Indigenous, have a disability or ongoing medical condition, or are participating in a select list of reciprocal student exchange programs qualify for priority access to housing. Additional information for both UBC campuses is available [here](#).

NEW: Media Studies at UBC-O

UBC Okanagan's [Bachelor of Media Studies](#) is designed for students to enter a career where they'll work with still images, sound design, videos, or create games. This hands-on degree is a computational arts program, which means students will gain coding skills to enhance and create their art. Applicants do not need any prior experience in programming – only a creative mindset and a willingness to explore.

UBC Bursary Program

Students with government student loans are eligible to apply for a UBC Bursary. This is non-repayable funding received directly from UBC. The bursary program is designed to help eligible students fill the gap between the cost of attending UBC and the amount of government student loan received. The application opens in the summer prior to the start of classes.

University of Victoria**Application deadline – January 31**

Students who have not yet applied can still submit an application to UVic. A reminder that the application deadline for September 2022 entry is **January 31, 2022**. The full application process is outlined in the [How to Apply](#) section of UVic's website.

Self-reporting – February 15 to March 15

The self-reporting system in the [My UVic Application](#) will open February 15. *Students can only self-report once*. Applicants self-report their grade 11 and grade 12 marks to be considered for a conditional offer of admission as well as grades-based entrance scholarships.

Early Admission Decisions

UVic's admissions office has sent close to 300 early admission decisions to high achieving BC applicants (with an admission average of 96% or higher). This small category of students is not required to self-report their grades, and they have been notified of this in their admission offer.

Applying for Residence

The on-campus housing application will be available in the [online housing portal](#) on **February 7**. The deadline to apply is May 1. The first-year residence guarantee is available for current high school applicants applying to UVic for September 2022.

Next Steps Events for Applicants

UVic will be hosting virtual 'Next Steps' events to help applicants prepare for self-reporting and the remainder of the application process and to introduce them to all that the faculty has to offer. These sessions will take place throughout February and March, and registration will be available in the coming weeks on [UVic's website](#).

Douglas College**Applications for Winter 2023**

On **Monday, Feb. 1 at 8:30 am**, Douglas' **Winter 2023** application portal will open. This is especially important for students who may have missed the application deadline for Academic Foundations for **Potential Nursing Applicants** for Fall 2022, as the **applications for this program are only open for three days, Monday, Feb 7 at 7:00 am**; closing Wednesday, Feb. 9 at 4:00 pm. Entrance Awards and Scholarships

More Transferability for Engineering

The [Engineering Foundations Certificate \(EFC\)](#) has a guaranteed transfer pathway to the [SFU Sustainable Energy Engineering \(SEE\)](#) program. This is on top of Douglas' other guaranteed transfer pathways to SFU, UVIC and UBC programs. The Foundations program allows students to get hands-on skills in their first year, something that many students do not get until later in their degrees.

Kwantlen Polytechnic University

Program Offers

The first wave of KPU's **Open Intake** offers for September 2022 have gone out and will continue to go out as students apply. A few things to note:

- KPU will review the final English mark and graduation status in July. Applicants need to ensure they have released their transcripts to KPU through the Student Transcript Service.
- The non-refundable deposit for domestic students is \$250.
- Deposits paid after June 1st will not receive priority registration.

Some KPU **Limited Intake offers** will start to go out in January. Competitive Entry Programs, like the Engineering Certificate, will not be sent out until late-March.

KPU is relaunching the Employment and Community Studies program for Fall 2022 and is currently accepting applications. Supplementary Essay (SE)

Students applying to the Bachelor of Commerce program (OUAC code QC) and/or either of the Bachelor of Health Sciences programs (OUAC code QH [Kingston campus] and QIH [BISC campus]) program are **required** to submit the Supplemental Essay (SE). We *recommend* those applying to the Bachelor of Nursing Science (QN) program complete and submit the Supplementary Essay. For all other programs there is no Supplementary Essay (SE) or Personal Statement of Experience (PSE) available.

Provincial Tuition Waiver Program

All students need to complete the Student Transcript Service (STS) before April 22nd in order to have their **interim** transcript automatically sent to their selected institutions and organizations. In July, **final** transcripts will be issued according to the selections chosen before April 22nd (including institutions outside of Canada, the NCAA Clearinghouse, and private institutions).
