## Residency Information

Students who want to live on campus are reminded that they should be submitting their application early to secure housing for the Fall. **In many cases, residency is guaranteed for first year students, but it is best to apply early. *The link to each residency website is hyperlinked below when you select the name.***

### In Province Institutions

#### CapU

- Applications are now available on a first-come, first-serve basis.

#### SFU

- Applications are open for SFU's residences. Students should not wait until they are admitted to apply: offers are sent based on the date of completed residence application. Studies show that students who live on campus have higher GPAs, easier transitions into university, and higher retention and graduation rates.

#### TRU

- Applications for **Residence on Campus** will open **February 1**.
- Students who apply before **March 1** are guaranteed housing.

#### TWU

- After you have applied to TWU, you can then apply for residence by paying a \$500 housing deposit. Deposits are non-refundable.

#### UBC

- Many prospective students will qualify for UBC's [First Year Guarantee](#) for Residence.
- First year students can open a residence application as soon as they complete their application to UBC.
- Separate residence applications are required for UBC Vancouver and UBC Okanagan.
- \$50 non-refundable application fee is required.
- Application Deadline: **May 1**.
- Roommate Group Request Deadline: **May 15**.

### UVIC

- **Application Period:** Monday **February 7** to May 1
- As a current high-school student in your graduating year, UVIC guarantees you a space for your first year in residence. That's the UVic [first-year guarantee](#).
- Residence Services offers ten living [learning communities \(LLCs\)](#) in single dormitory rooms and in the Cluster neighbourhood. These unique residence communities encourage interaction by bringing together students with common interests or areas of study. Each LLC provides focused programming and events to connect you with other students who share your passions.

### **Out of Province Institutions**

#### U of A

- U of A offers guaranteed housing for first-year undergraduates applying to Edmonton campuses.
- Application deadline: **April 30**.

#### U of C

- Applications for residency opened on December 10.
- First year students who apply by the deadline have a two-year housing guarantee.
- Application deadline: **May 1**.

#### U of S

- Applications for residency for Fall 2022 are opened on the Residency Housing Portal.
- Applications are considered on a first-come, first served basis regardless of admission status so students who are planning to attend U of S are encouraged to apply to live in residence as soon as possible.
- Students entering their first year of studies at the University of Saskatchewan are guaranteed accommodations at Voyageur

Place Residence if they meet the criteria listed on the [U of S website](#) and if they apply for Residence before **January 31**.

### McGill

- If you requested to live in residence on your initial application, the status of your residence offer will be indicated on your acceptance letter from McGill Admissions and on [Minerva](#).
- McGill is pleased to **guarantee residence accommodation** to all newly admitted undergraduate students.
- Students with guaranteed residence admission, including scholarship students, must have already paid a \$1500 residence deposit along with a \$30 residence application fee by the **application deadline in early July 2022** in order to confirm their space in residence.

### Queen's

- Queen's will guarantee a residence space for incoming first year students. The guarantee is available only to students who submit the residence application and pay their \$525 deposit by the **June 8** deadline. Students must accept their Queen's offer of admission before applying to residence.
- **First-year residence application opens March 1**
- Application deadline: **June 8**

### Waterloo

- Before you apply for residence, you must first accept your offer of admission from the University of Waterloo.
- You have until **June 1** to accept your offer.

### U of T

- Residence is guaranteed for all new full-time students entering their first year of university in an undergraduate program, provided that they have indicated their interest in residence by completing the MyRes application by **March 31** and receive and accept an offer of admission by **June 1**.

### Self-Reporting

- The self-reporting period opens on **February 15** and closes on **March 15**
- Current Grade 12 students **MUST** self-report their interim/final Grade 11 and 12 marks by **March 15, 2022** to be considered for admission and grade-based entrance scholarships for September 2022 entry
- You can **only self-report your grades once**, so be sure to wait until you have your Semester 1 marks (February 4).
- Students who meet all of UVic's [admission requirements](#) and have satisfactory admission averages will be eligible to receive early conditional offers of acceptance
- If you don't receive an early conditional offer based on your self-reported grades, students will automatically be reconsidered when UVic picks up your grades in May IF you have completed the Student Transcript Service
- If you are taking a DL or on-line course you can self-report a midterm grade as long as you have already completed 50% or more of the course including assignments and tests. The entire course must be 100% completely finished no later than **June 30**.

- The Ministry of Education Ministry District/Authority Award recognizes students for excellence in one of the following seven areas of interest or strength:
  1. **Indigenous Languages and Culture:** commitment to language revitalization or indigenous culture in school or the community
  2. **Fine Arts:** 3-4 courses (in and/or out of school) in one of Visual Arts, Dance, Drama, Music
  3. **Applied Skills:** 3-4 courses in one of Business Ed, Technology Ed, Computers, Home Economics
  4. **Physical Activity:** Provincial/National participation in Athletics, Dance, or Gymnastics, and PHE senior courses
  5. **International Languages:** 2 or more languages documented or transcript, besides English
  6. **Community Service:** local, global and cultural experience
  7. **Technical and Trades Training:** Carpentry, Automotive, Electrical, Cook Training
- *Please note:* The District/Authority Scholarship is a separate application found in the 2022 WGSS Scholarship Team folder under #4.
- **Deadline: March 8, 2022, 12:00 noon** to the WGSS Counselling Centre, with the exception of those who want to be considered for the Indigenous, Languages and Culture categories. The deadline is one month earlier as the winner is selected by the District Indigenous Department; please contact Ms. Docherty by **February 8** if you wish to be considered for District Authority in the Indigenous Category.

## Provincial Tuition Waiver Program

The Provincial Tuition Waiver Program supports B.C. students who are former youth in care who are attending either full-time or part-time studies at a B.C. public post-secondary institution, Native Education College or one of 10 eligible union trades training centres. If you meet the eligibility requirements, tuition and mandatory fees charged by the institution could be waived so you do not have to pay. This includes any deposits that an institution may require to secure admission or space in a program or class.

**Beedie Luminaries**

- \$40,000 per student / 4-year undergraduate degree
- \$15,000 per student / 2-year college or trade-school diploma
- This BC scholarship is designed to help 50 students who otherwise would **not** have the opportunity for post-secondary education
- This year, in light of the labour shortage within the **skilled trades** sector, Beedie would like to particularly encourage students considering a career in the trades to apply.

**Eligibility Criteria:**

- Have faced financial adversity
- Have a minimum overall grade average of 75% in most recently completed school year
- Have made contributions to home and/or community
- Must be planning to attend one of 25 BC post-secondary institutions

**BC Excellence Scholarship**

- Value \$5,000
- The BC Excellence Scholarship is awarded to 55 students who are nominated by their school (one nomination per high school). The Ministry of Education is looking for demonstrated community service, both inside and outside school, as well as aptitude and commitment to a chosen career path.
- Additional criteria include:
  - "B" (73% or above) in their Language Arts 11 final mark
  - "B" average in final course marks that fulfill graduation requirements of Science 11 or 12, Math 11 and Social Studies 11 or 12, with no more than

one "C+" (67% or above) final course mark (marks lower than “C+” are not accepted)

- Maintaining a “B” average or better in Grades 11 and 12 final course marks required for graduation
- Students who wish to be considered for nomination must submit the following items to Ms. Kifiak by **Friday, January 14**
  1. Print a completed copy of the application form which includes a 500-word essay describing community service, volunteer activity, and/or leadership role. - Individuals eligible to receive full funding for their education elsewhere cannot apply for this scholarship.

All students need to complete the Student Transcript Service (STS) before April 22<sup>nd</sup> in order to have their **interim** transcript automatically sent to their selected institutions and organizations. In July, **final** transcripts will be issued according to the selections chosen before April 22<sup>nd</sup> (including institutions outside of Canada, the NCAA Clearinghouse, and private institutions).
