Scholarship Information

The Langley School District Foundation oversees the scholarship fund which is available to Grade 12 students pursuing posts-secondary studies in Langley School District. The Foundation works with private donors, businesses, service clubs, PACs, and other organizations to generously make scholarships available to SD35 graduates. Each donor identifies specific criteria for their award. The amounts of awards available vary.

“Open or District” awards are available to all Grade 12s. Students compete with other Langley District students for approximately 40 District Awards. A listing of the District Awards is on pages 10 and 11 of the [Scholarship Handbook](#). Be aware that the list provided is subject to change.

“Local” awards are designated for students who attend particular high schools. The scholarship committee in the student’s home school determines the recipients of the Local Awards. A listing of the Local (school specific) Awards is located on each [school’s website](#). Be aware that the list provided subject to change.

Students who win either the Open or the Local award have two years from graduation to claim their award. This is done by completing the “[Claim Form](#)” (available from their home school) or from the District website. Students must provide proof of tuition payment to their school counsellor. Students generally receive a cheque in the mail from Langley School District Foundation to the address indicated on their Claim Form within a month of the submission of the required paperwork. The 2022 Claim Form will not be available until April, 2022.

To be considered for Langley School District scholarships, the student must:

- ✓ Be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident (landed immigrant)
- ✓ Must graduate this school year
- ✓ Minimum average of 67% over grades 11 and 12
- ✓ GPA is calculated on the best 12 courses but must include: Language Arts 11 + 12, a Socials Studies 11 or 12, a Mathematics 11 or 12 and a Science 11 or 12.
- ✓ Display satisfactory qualities of attendance, punctuality, initiative and cooperation
- ✓ Complete the school’s application form in full (incomplete applications will not be considered)
- ✓ Meet the specified criteria for the award
- ✓ Have a valid Social Insurance Number at the time of application

Application Form

Every Langley Secondary School has their own scholarship application. The form is usually available on the school's website by January and is due by late February. Check with your school's counselling department for additional information about how to apply for this scholarship in your school.
