DO YOU QUALIFY?

Nominees must be:

- 1. Between the ages of 15 to 21 as of March 10th, 2023
- 2. A Langley resident and/or a person who has made a significant contribution within either the City or Township of Langley (except for International Service, where the applicant must be a resident of Langley) and have outstanding leadership skills. ISP students are eligible If they are registered in a Langley school and have proof of their birthdate. ISP students don't need a SIN number.
- 3. Applicants cannot be the winners of any category in any previous years.
- 4. Runners up (those finishing second or third from previous years) as well as all others may apply.

Other Information

- 3 individuals, per category, are shortlisted, then interviewed on Saturday April 1, 2023. From these interviews, 1 winner and 2 runners up, per category, are selected. Some applicants may be video taped.
- Proof of age (birth certificate or driver's license) required at the time of applying.
- Members of the four Rotary Clubs of Langley as well as individuals involved in youth programs, other community organizations, and prominent community members make up the Selection Committee.
- The SASSY Awards Langley Committee reserves the right to seek additional applications at any time and the right to decline applications/nominations. All their decisions are final. The SASSY Awards Langley Selection committee reserves the right to move the applicant/nominee to the most applicable award category.

All three finalists must attend the Awards Show at Chief Sepass Theatre on Thursday, May 4th, 2023, to receive their awards. The three finalists in each category won't know the first place winner until the Awards show

Each Category Award Winner receives

- \$1,000 Cash Award
- SASSY Recognition award

Two runners up in each of the 7 categories receive \$500.00 cash award

Community Service (Local and International)

Outstanding leadership contribution in one of the two communities of Langley

- Starting/significantly supporting, in a leadership role, a local charity or organization
- Contributing to make the charity, organization or initiative sustainable and ongoing
- Volunteering and making a considerable difference in the local community
- Being a role model for youth and encouraging their involvement in community service

Youth Leadership

Outstanding leadership contribution by motivating and empowering young people in one of the two communities of Langley

- Taking a leadership role in their endeavor
- Creating or significantly supporting opportunities for youth to participate in a program, event, initiative, council or group
- Mentoring and being a role model to youth in school or community activities

Sports Leadership

Outstanding leadership contribution as an athlete or coach in one of the two communities of Langley.

- Taking a leadership role in their endeavor
- Leading, supporting and mentoring youth to participate in sport
- Empowering youth to enhance their skills and abilities in sport
- Being a role model for youth in sport

Leadership Beyond Adversity

Youth who have overcome difficult circumstances, reached personal goals and have taken a leadership role in one of the two communities of Langley.

- Having made a positive impact in the community in a leadership role
- Emerged as a leader in school or community activities while learning to overcome challenges

Cultural and Diversity Leadership

Outstanding leadership contribution by enhancing awareness and acceptance of those who might otherwise be marginalized because of race, culture or other forms of diversity.

- Taking a leadership role by implementing culture, diversity and inclusion awareness training or learning activities or events
- The endeavor/event has the potential to impact the greater community.
- Being a role model for youth and encouraging their involvement in promoting, culture,, diversity and inclusion

Environmental Leadership

Outstanding leadership contribution in one of the two communities of Langley

- Taking a leadership role in the effective implementation of an environmental initiative
- Committed involvement on environmental issues in the community
- Empowering and increasing the capacity and leadership skills of peers to be involved in environmental activities

Arts and Culture Leadership

Outstanding leadership contribution in the local arts and cultural community (including performing, visual and literary arts organizations and events) in one of the two communities of Langley.

- Taking a leadership role in their endeavor
- Creating or significantly supporting opportunities for youth to participate in arts and cultural activities, events and organizations
- Empowering youth to enhance their skills and abilities in the literary, performing or visual arts
- Being a role model for youth involved in the arts and cultural activities
